You know, like, in the sense of what he got up to ...

(Yeah — there's that bit that is "that's not my niece, that's my daughter!" (laughter)

Charlie

Yeah.... for example!! (laughter). But other things that he's talking about are instantly recognisable from modern culture, aren't they? You know - from kind of 'bloke', 'laddish' banter about..

Audience Member Male 1 Yeah, about the objectification of women and how people are sort of passed round. That still happens. That still happens..

Charlie

Yeah and how he was kind of sharing it with us. Like - "This is what works for me, mate!"

But then he kind of met his match and got his heart broken, so, you know... which was, kind of, his just desserts really, wasn't it? (laughter)

We've just come out - what did you think?
